Section 5001(a) of the Commonwealth Employment Act, as amended, provides:  
 Every alien who remains in the Commonwealth longer than 90 days shall by regulation be required to be registered. Registration shall be renewed annually. The parents or legal guardians of aliens under the age of 18 are responsible for such child's registration.

The alien named above hereby provides registration information as follows:

## INSTRUCTIONS FOR REGISTRATION

1. Purpose: The purpose of registration is simply to account for all aliens who are currently in the Commonwealth and have been in the Commonwealth for a consecutive 90 days or longer. Registration is not related to status. Persons who may be out-of-status may register so that if benefits become available for which they are eligible, they will be on record.
2. Who must register? Every alien must register, including all minor children. Parents or guardians should register for minor children. Fill out a separate form for each person.
3. What kind of document is issued? Every alien who registers will get a registration card.
4. What agency is conducting the registration? Alien registration has been required in the Commonwealth since 1985. In the past, the Division of Immigration handled some registrations and other registrations were done together with the issuance of work permits. This year, the Legislature has given to the Department of Labor the responsibility for all alien registrations.
5. Where is registration done? There are several ways to register.
  - a. By employment contract: Every alien who has a CNMI-approved employment contract is automatically registered and needs to do nothing further.
  - b. By Commerce permit: Every alien who has a permit approved by the CNMI Department of Commerce (investors, business owners, students) is automatically registered and needs do nothing further.
  - c. In-person: Any alien may come to the Department of Labor and register in person.
6. When is registration? All registrations for Department of Labor contracts and Department of Commerce permits has been completed. Registration for aliens formerly registered by the Immigration Division and all other aliens will begin on September 7, 2010 under a schedule published on the website, in the newspapers, and at the Department.
7. What documentation is required? Aliens who register must complete the registration form, provide a passport-sized photo, and present sufficient identification (passport, driver's license, umbrella permit, etc.).
8. What if I have no documents? You should register whether you have valid documents or not. Some classes of persons who, under the Governor's Protocol, are entitled to be in the Commonwealth may as yet have no documents. Registration is not a status process. There is no penalty for registration without documents. There is a statutory penalty for not registering.
